James 5:16 Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. NKJV

"Oh God of the Universe! Although unworthy through my manifestold transgressions, I approach the seat of thy mercy, to crave thy favor, and to seek thy protection. I supplicate thy forgiveness, O most merciful Father, for the many transgressions and the often repeated disobedience, which cause Thee to command destruction over me. Behold me now, O my Father, supplicating Thy protection! Thou who art near when all other aid faileth! O spare me, guard me from the evil that is impending!

This once happy country is inflamed by the fury of war; a menacing enemy is arrayed against the rights, liberties and freedom of this, our Confederacy; the ambition of this enemy has dissolved fraternal love, and the hand of fraternity has been broken asunder by the hands of those, who sit now in council and meditate our chastisement, with the chastisement of scorpions. Our firesides are threatened; the foe is before us, with the declared intention to desecrate our soil, to murder our people, and to deprive us of the glorious inheritance which was left to us by the immortal fathers of this once great Republic.

Here I stand now with many thousands of the sons of the South, to face the foe, to drive him back, and to defend our natural rights. O Lord, God of Israel, be with me in the hot season of the contending strife; protect and bless me with health and courage to bear cheerfully the hardships of war.

My hope, my faith, my strength are in Thee, O Lord, my God, forever— in Thee is my trust. "For thy salvation do I hope, O Lord! I hope for Thy salvation, O Lord! O Lord, for Thy salvation do I hope!" Amen! Amen!"

Today as we approach the month of April and the Celebration of Confederate Heritage let us not cease in prayer to stand against those who would desire to destroy the cause to which we stand.

Quotes taken from the booklet, <u>May I Quote You General Forrest</u> observations and Utterances from the South's Greatest General, edited by Randall Bedwell.

- "Never stand and take a charge –charge them too." Nathan Bedford Forrest
- We'll be whipped like hell tomorrow." General Forrest to General William J. Hardee on the night of April 7, 1862 – before the Union's victorious counter attack at Shiloh.
- I have written to him. I have sent to him. I have given him information of the condition of the Federal Army. What does he fight battles for?" Forrest on Braxton Bragg, when Bragg did not follow up his victory at Chickamauga, 1863
- "Boys, did you hear that musketry and that artillery? It means that our friends are falling by the hundreds at the hands of the enemy, and we are here guarding a damned creek! Let's go and help them. What do you say?" - Forrest to his men at Shiloh, 1862

"General Forrest, I wish to congratulate you and those brave men moving across that field like veteran infantry upon their magnificent behavior". General D. H. Hill on Forrest's troops at Chickamauga.


