~Battle Report~

That evening as many of the men sat around small camp fires and wood heaters, one could see the many small columns of white smoke rising and then drifting down wind to disappear. It was at this moment that a Lieutenant approached from the darkness and called for volunteers. As the word spread from campfires and heaters and from frost covered tents every man responded by leaving the security of their comfort and gathered around the lieutenant. The officer spoke to them asking for five volunteers at which all of the men drew closer in response to the officer's request. Picking five men he dismissed the others and then began to instruct the remaining five on what was needed. The Lieutenant began by telling the men that they were to set off early before light and approach the river, once at the river two of them were to cut two ropes while the other three watched and stood guard. After receiving their instructions the men retired to their tents wrote letters to be left with friends and prayed knowing dawn would come early.

At the appointed time as if each of the men knew, each of them awoke without speaking a word gathered together, prayed, and then disappeared into the woods as the faint evidence of a new day could be seen approaching. An hour or more passed before they came to the wooded slope leading them down to the river. There at the river's edge their eyes saw their objective through the cold fog as it moved over the waters.

Moving through the woods with silent determination and quickness three of the men positioned themselves so they could watch over the other two men as they moved closer to carry out their instructions. Quickly their sharp blades severed the two ropes. As the last rope separated its hold the bridge fell into the waters of the river and was carried away downstream to lie against the far bank.

Reassured that no one could cross the cold fast moving waters of the river today the five men turned and made their way back the way they had come. Shielded by fog and woods the enemy fire from the other side of the river could not find its mark as the five men moved farther into the dark woods.

Later that morning as the sun had now broken the horizon they reported back to the Officer and informed him of their success. The Officer said everyone in camp had heard the gun fire and knew for sure that someone must have cut down a hornets' nest. "Well done good and faithful servants", the Officer said to them. "You have done well; ahead of us today are even greater rewards." At that the whole camp rose up and with one mission now that their flank was secured they moved forward as one against the divided enemy camp which was now separated from help.

The rest of the story continues today in our own lives. As a new year has begun each of us as Sons of Confederate Veterans know well that the battle is not over. Just as all of the men in the story stepped forward so also it is my prayer that each of us also steps forward. Stepping forward in faith to do even the smallest thing so that as faithful servants to the cause for which we all stand for, even greater rewards will be given to those who follow us. May God Bless each of you this year in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

TITLE 38—UNITED STATES CODE VETERANS' BENEFITS

§ 1501. Definitions

(3) The term "Civil War veteran" includes a person who served in the military or naval forces of the Confederate States of America during the Civil War, and the term "active military or naval service" includes active service in those forces.

§ 2306. Headstones, markers, and burial receptacles

- (a) The Secretary shall furnish, when requested, appropriate Government headstones or markers at the expense of the United States for the unmarked graves of the following:
 - Any individual buried in a national cemetery or in a post emetery.
- (2) Any individual eligible for burial in a national cemetery (but not buried there), except for those persons or classes of persons enumerated in section 2402(a)(4), (5), and (6) of this title.

(3) Soldiers of the Union and Confederate Armies of the Civil War.
